Formerly: There are only two reasons why you'd have any reason to go to Liquid Kitty: proximity to the Brown/Purple Chicago El stop and the appetizers. Decked out in seventies pukey purple and orange decor with ripped up pleather barstools, for all its hipness, Liquid Kitty is still rather sparse. The starters are definitely a treat: you won't get enough of the artichoke fritters, and the cumin coconut chicken skewers with peanut sauce are tasty. However, its ostensibly Cajun entree menu leaves much to be desired. "Momma's Burger" tastes a bit like cafeteria-style Salisbury steak and the difference between their Cajun fries and regular generic restaurant fries is hard to tell. The seafood fettuccini is overly salted and the seafood risotto is oddly over spiced. The service ran from 'too cool for school' to downright careless. If you're in the neighborhood, just do yourself a favor and go to Bar Louie instead. (Claire Zulkey)
